The initial concept of a short, low-floor, easy-access unit which could be towed, setup and operated by staff unused to towing, often in places in which larger promotional trailers cannot access, was first trialled in 1998 and actively promoted from 2003.

Since then a number of Councils have bought either 2½-metre X25s or the longer X30 / X35 versions, mostly for use in their Recycling & Waste Management Departments' awareness campaigns, but also for publicising other Council activities and more generally engaging with the public.

This series of single-axle trailers comes in three standard sizes – 2½, 3 and 3½ metre bodies (X25, X30 and X35). Low floor access necessitates wheel-boxes; if greater floor space is needed they can be built as "high-floor" units without wheel-boxes. All can have steps and/or ramps for public and staff access, with either fully-opening or bi-fold doors incorporating handrails alongside the entrance.

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
